Dr. Megan Healy serves on Governor Northam's Cabinet as his Chief Workforce Development Advisor. As the Commonwealth's highest ranking workforce officer, she oversees a range of regional, state, and federal programs that connect Virginians to the skills, training, and opportunities they need to thrive in the 21st century economy. In addition to her partners within government, Secretary Healy works closely with Virginia's labor and business communities to identify and fill vacant jobs in high demand sectors.

Having started her career as science professor at Patrick Henry Community College in Martinsville, Secretary Healy keenly appreciates how education can change lives and communities. Prior to joining the Northam administration, she served as Virginia's first Director of STEM-H under Governor McAuliffe before returning to the Virginia Community College System as Assistant Vice Chancellor for Academics. Secretary Megan Healy is a proud product of Virginia's public schools, holding a bachelor's degree from Virginia Tech, a master's from Virginia Commonwealth University, and a doctorate from Old Dominion University.

Dr. Kartik Athreya is executive vice president and director of research at the Federal Reserve Bank of Richmond. Dr. Athreya's work has been published in a variety of academic journals, including the Journal of Monetary Economics, American Economic Journal: Macroeconomics, and International Economic Review. He is also an associate editor at the Journal of Economic Dynamics and Control. In recent years, Dr. Athreya has taught a doctoral course in macroeconomics at the University of Virginia and authored a book entitled Big Ideas in Macroeconomics (2013, MIT Press). He earned his doctorate from the University of Iowa in 2000.

Dr. Athreya's research interests are in macroeconomics and consumer finance. His current research aims to measure and understand household financial distress and debt repayment decisions, to quantify the links between household investments in human capital and in the stock market, and to assess the importance of risks associated with college enrollment for educational attainment and inequality

Mr. Jason Miller is the Chief Executive Officer of the Greater Washington Partnership, taking the helm of the new organization in April 2017. The Partnership is comprised of a group of leading, civic-minded CEOs and entrepreneurs from the Capital Region of Baltimore, Washington, and Richmond, who have come together to address the critical economic issues facing the region and ensure it remains one of the world's best places to live, work and build a business.

Prior to this role, Mr. Miller was the Deputy Assistant to the President and Deputy Director of the National Economic Council in the White House, joining the Obama Administration in 2010. Mr. Miller led the Obama Administration's economic policy development and coordination on manufacturing and innovation, transportation and infrastructure, tax policy, energy, entrepreneurship, and Puerto Rico.

Previously, Mr. Miller was a management consultant with The Boston Consulting Group in San Francisco and with Marakon Associates in Chicago, where he advised large corporations across industries on strategic, financial and organizational issues. Mr. Miller received a B.A. from the University of Pennsylvania, a M.B.A. from the Kellogg School of Management at Northwestern University, and a M.P.A. from Harvard's Kennedy School of Government. Mr. Miller currently resides with his wife and three children in Chevy Chase, Maryland.

Mr. Darius A. Johnson is Vice President-Employee Engagement & Development for Dominion Energy. He is responsible for working with the company's business units on leadership and talent management, including workforce and succession planning, rotation programs, the career center and development of high-potential individuals.

Mr. Johnson joined the company in 2016 as director-Cash Management after a nearly 20- year career in banking at Bank of America Merrill Lynch and Premier Bank, Inc. He began his current job in July. He earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Virginia and an MBA from University of Richmond, and completed the ABA Stonier Graduate School of Banking at University of Pennsylvania. Mr. Johnson holds a number of senior positions in community organizations in the greater Richmond area.
