Virginia Talent + Opportunity Partnership (V-TOP)

Background

The Virginia Talent + Opportunity Partnership (V-TOP) is a formally established collaboration between the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia (SCHEV), the Virginia Chamber Foundation, and the Virginia Business Higher Education Council. V-TOP is funded through the Commonwealth Innovative Internship Fund.

Purpose


V-TOP is grounded in statute: Statewide initiative to facilitate the <u>readiness</u> of students, employers, and institutions to participate in internship and work-based learning (Va. Code § 23.1-903.4).

- Grants to institutions to expand paid and credit-bearing student internships and other work-based learning opportunities in collaboration with Virginia employers.
- Statewide initiative to facilitate the readiness of students, employers, and institutions of higher education to participate in internship and work-based learning.



Virginia Talent + Opportunity Partnership Goal

• Have the most internship-ready students, employers and institutions of higher education.



• Every graduate of a Virginia two-year and four-year institution has participated in at least one paid or credit-bearing student internship or work-based learning (WBL) opportunity.



Student Readiness

- Launched student career-readiness and internship toolkit online modules
 - First-year and second-year experience (iGrow with V-TOP)
- Secured proclamation by Governor Youngkin for July 28, 2022, and July 27, 2023, to be known as Virginia Intern Day
- Provided professional development scholarships for graduate students exploring a career in career services or PK-12 Career and Technical Education (CTE)
- Piloted the Commonwealth of Virginia (COVA) summer program in partnership with the Virginia Department of Human Resources to enhance state agency internships and offer professional development to student interns.





Employer Readiness

- Launched employer readiness "Developing an Internship Program" on-demand, online modules.
- Procured a statewide staffing agency for VA-based small businesses (250 or fewer employees) 30+ employers are participating in the program
- Allocated matching funds to VA-based small businesses (150 or fewer employees)
- Acquired 108 mentorship training slots through Mentor VA for employers, supervisors, and students
- Recognized 100 top employers on Virginia Intern Day on July 27, 2023





Institutional Readiness

Grants

- Awarded Vision Grants to **nine** institutions (eight public, one private)
- Transforming Federal Work-Study grants awarded to **eight** public institutions in 2023.
- New Grants: Institutional Readiness Student Support (received 12 responses from public institutions), and Institutional Data Collection grants (received 12 responses from public institutions)

Professional Development & Training

- Professional development scholarships (**up to \$2500**) to career practitioners or internship coordinators at institutions
- Engaged three community colleges in the Works work-ethic certification training.



V-TOP Regional Collaborative

Goal

Funds one or two people who are responsible for thinking every day about how to:

- Identify and link existing work-based learning activities
- Present those opportunities to employers
- Support employers, students, and institutions of higher education

- Regional chambers of commerce
- Economic development partnerships

V-TOP's Top 2023 Highlights

State-level

- Established baseline data outcomes: SCHEV/V-TOP conducted a <u>credit-bearing</u> internship outcomes report from 2020-2022.
 - AY19-20 **(22,946**), AY20-21 **(19,455)**, and AY 21-22 **(21,228)**
- Collaboration: Piloted the Commonwealth of Virginia (COVA) summer program in partnership with the Virginia Department of Human Resources
- Expansion: Hired new staff, Fiscal Services Specialist and Work-Based Learning Analyst
- Increased state and national awareness: Presented at the VA Chamber/VBHEC annual Education & Workforce Conference, Southern Association of Colleges and Employers (SoACE), VCCS Hire Education Conference, Virginia Association of Colleges and Employers and participated in a podcast with the Metropolitan Educational Research Consortium (MERC)



V-TOP's Top 2023 Highlights

Student + Employer + Institutional Readiness

- Combined student and employer readiness modules of over 1,000 users since November 2022.
- Summer 2023 All **9** regions are funded and operational
- Recognized 100 top employers on Virginia Intern Day on July 27, 2023 (69% increase from 2022)
- Combined 30+ employers using iQuasar, the statewide staffing agency, and matching funds services in 2023.
- Awarded over a million dollars in grants to institutions in 2023.
 - Regional Collaborative, Vision Grants, Transformation of Federal Work-Study, Professional Development Scholarships, and Mike Rowe Works Curriculum



2024 Next Steps for V-TOP

Expand internal capacity

- Hire additional V-TOP Staff Associate for Work-Based Learning Initiative
- Expand the Commonwealth of Virginia (COVA) Connection Internship program involve state agencies and student interns.

Address data collection needs and legislative outcomes

- Compile and complete the credit-bearing internship report for AY 2022-2023
- Complete the Annual Progress Report in collaboration with the Virginia Department of Workforce Development and Advancement § 23.1-903.4
- Explore **student survey options**: National Survey of College Internships (NSCI), National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE), and the National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE).
- Monitor the outcomes and recommendations of the SB 1280 Workgroup.



2024 Next Steps for V-TOP

Expand resources and outreach efforts

Continue to scale activities referenced under statewide resources and readiness outcomes.

- Student Readiness:
 - Increase the number of student interns (100) recruited through the staffing agency services.
- **Employer Readiness:**
 - Increase the number of employers participating in the staffing agency and matching funds services.

 - Increase the number of employers participating in Virginia Intern Day by 80% in 2024
 Communicate the importance of providing paid internship opportunities broadly with the business community.
 - Advocate for mentorship activities within a student's internship experience.
- Institutional Readiness:
 - Award over three million in grants Institutional Readiness Student Support, Data Collection, and Implementation Grants

Utilize Metropolitan Educational Research Consortium (MERC) resources and recommendations

Continue using a statewide system change approach to support agreed-upon talent pathways and definitions for internships and work-based learning experiences.
